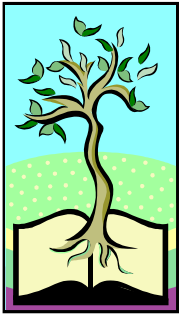

**Community Partnership for Egg Harbor Township Schools, Inc.
Names New Leadership Team, Adds New Members**

EGG HARBOR TOWNSHIP – The Community Partnership for Egg Harbor Township Schools has elected two new officers and added two members during its May and July meetings.

The Board elected Louis DeScioli of Egg Harbor Township as Chairman. He succeeds outgoing Chairman Peter E. Castellano, Egg Harbor Township Board of Education member, who founded the organization in 2006 and will remain a member of the Community Partnership Board. DeScioli is a realtor with Prudential Fox & Roach and is also the owner of the Somers Point and Upper Township Custard Hut ice cream retail stores.

Charles P. Donovan, Jr., of Egg Harbor Township, was named Vice Chairman of the non-profit charity. Donovan is vice president of investments for UBS Financial Services. Both DeScioli and Donovan have a long history with the Egg Harbor Township School District currently providing leadership to the Egg Harbor Township High School Interact Club and having previously served as Home & School Association representatives. Kathleen Allen, CPA and assistant business administrator for the school district will remain as Treasurer of the organization.

New members appointed to the Board include Dawn Brodton, who is responsible for Ocean City Home Bank's AVP Regional Branch Development, and George Wilkinson, AP Calculus teacher and track and football coach at Egg Harbor Township High School. Board of Education; Dr. Philip Heery, superintendent of schools; Paul W. Hodson, E.H.T. committeeman; Hak Kim, AtlantiCare's corporate director of business planning; Kathy Rubba, vice president of business development for Ocean City Home Bank; Kathy Waszen, E.H.T. teacher and president of the E.H.T. Education Association; and Ellen Gregory, director of development for the district who also serves as executive director of the Foundation.
